New Beginnings Animal Rescue

Important Reminders:

- * Remember to provide a sufficient amount of hay at night and in the morning. Buns should not run out of hay!
- * Notify us a week in advance of running out of supplies so we can coordinate delivery.
- * Continue to brush your rabbit daily. Any fur you brush off is less fur in their digestive tract.
- * Daily pellets and greens should be divided in to a morning and evening feeding for two opportunities to observe the rabbit for changes in appetite or mannerisms.
- * Buns should be getting 2 cups a day of fresh greens, divided into two feedings.
- * Take apart and thoroughly clean all water bowls every time you refill the water to eliminate pink/invisible mold.
- * Sprinkle a light layer of fresh litter over the wet and dirty ares of the litter pan every day to be better able to tell if the bun is pooping regularly. Observation is KEY!

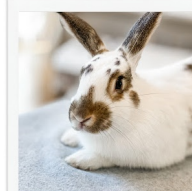
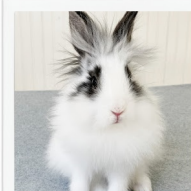
We have 181 followers already! We try to post daily to attract attention to our precious bunnies.

WE LOVE OUR FOSTERS!

VEGGIES - YES Most of the fresh vegetables we feed rabbits have a low level of oxalic acid and are fine to feed every day. These are additions to the base of Romaine or Leaf lettuce.	VEGGIES - LIMITED The following should be fed SPARINGLY due to high levels of oxalic acid / calcium / starch / sugar.	TREATS The best treat for your rabbits is fresh or freeze-dried fruit. Limit treats to no more than 1 Tbsp/day.
Arugula Basil Bok Choy/Pak Choy Carrot tops (only) Chicory Cilantro Dandelion greens & flowers (no pesticides) Dill leaves Endive Escarole Fennel (leafy tops & base) Lettuce, Bib Lettuce, Butter Lettuce, Frisee Lettuce, Green leaf Lettuce, Red leaf Lettuce, Romaine Mint (any variety) Radicchio Raspberry leaves Snow Peas Spring greens Squash fruit & flowers Wheatgrass	Beet greens Carrots Celery Collard Greens Kale (all types) Mustard greens Parsley Radish tops Spinach Sprouts Swiss chard Turnip greens	Apple (any type, but no stem, no seeds) Apricot Banana (no more than 2 slices) Blueberries Cherries (no pits) Kiwi Mango Melons (any type, but no seeds) Nectarine Papaya Peach Pear Pineapple (no skin) Plum (no pits) Raspberries Strawberries (and leaves)
NO - The following food should NOT be fed to rabbits.
